



Gospel Tract

NYC 2021 Young People's Retreat

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- 1. Prayerful Consideration.** As you read the message outlines and go through the retreat, consider which points impressed or touched you. Write down these points.
- 2. Share.** Share with your group the points you wrote down.
- 3. Title.** What do you want the gospel tract to be about? Pick a title that would grab people's attention, such as *"Is Jesus in Your Boat?"* or *"Life or Death"* or *"The Big Question."*
- 4. Opening.** Once you have determined the title, write out a strong opening sentence, or a few sentences, that would capture people's attention. It could be a question, something that everyone relates to, or anything else you can think of. For example, an opening question that pricks the mind is, "When is the last time you thought about the meaning of your life?"

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5. **Details.** Start writing out the rest of the tract. You can tell a relatable story, use an illustration, expound on the truths in the Bible, etc.... Remember, the intended audience is unbelievers, and your goal is that by the end of the tract, the audience will feel compelled to be saved and pray to receive the Lord.
6. **Closing Prayer.** At the end of the tract, write down a prayer that the audience could pray to receive the Lord.
7. **Final Read.** Read through the whole tract. Does anything need adjusting?
8. **Typeset/Layout.** Use an application like Word or Canva or PowerPoint to make the tract ready for use.
